- Recently, I've heard and noticed that there has been a trickle of folks leaving Mass early, immediately after they have received Communion. Please remember that the Mass is *not* over after Communion time, but that we remain for **prayer** and a **final blessing!** Additionally, I would like to encourage and invite all to remember our bishop's highlighting of the opportunity, following the recession of the priest, to give quiet thanks in community for what we have received at the Mass. If leaving Mass early is a temptation, I beg that you consider our time as community on Sunday as a call and a gift, and unless it's an emergency, I humbly ask that every effort be made to remain for the entirety of our liturgy.

- Our Director of Religious Education, J.B. Kelly, recently attended the St. John Bosco Conference for Evangelization & Catechesis at Franciscan University of Steubenville (OH). Author and Biblical scholar Dr. Scott Hahn, Bishop David Ricken (Diocese of Green Bay), and Jim Beckman (parishioners would recognize him from the SYMBOLON program) were among the presenters. The conference featured approximately 100 workshops for religious educators and catechists and drew laity and religious alike from all across the country (and even Canada and Nigeria!). ADORATION: The Blessed Sacrament is exposed on First Fridays from 9:30 a.m. until Benediction at 9:30 p.m.

BAPTISM OF INFANTS: Preparation classes for registered parishioners are scheduled for the last Tuesday of each month at 6:00 p.m. Parents of newborns must register for the class at least one week prior by calling Chris Brown at 417-988-2642. A date for the baptism will be scheduled following class attendance.

BAPTISM OF ADULTS: Please contact the parish office to arrange for participation in RCIA.

MARRIAGE PREPARATION: Our diocesan policy requires the parish priest be contacted at least six months prior to the *proposed* date of the couples' wedding to schedule preparation catechesis.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: If facing serious illness, please contact the parish office to arrange for anointing.

CONFIRMATION: Preparation for Confirmation in 2018 began August 21, 2016 for 8th-11th grade students.

“Quotables” on the Liturgy: “The august sacrifice of the altar is concluded with communion or the partaking of the divine feast. But, as all know, the integrity of the sacrifice only requires that the priest partake of the heavenly food. Although it is most desirable that the people should also approach the holy table, this is not required for the integrity of the sacrifice.” [Pope Pius XII, Encyclical on the Sacred Liturgy, 112]

17th Sunday in Ordinary Time: Jesus continues teaching with parables: the Hidden Treasure (Matt. 13:44), the Pearl of Great Price (Matt. 13:45-46), the Dragnet (Matt. 13:47-50). These stress that the kingdom’s value is inestimable, and surrendering earthly attachments is required to obtain it.
